



DIRECTORS' REPORT













Honorable Shareholders

On 16 October, 2019 Honorable High Court has given the judgment in favor of NESCO to hold previous 13 AGMs (2006 to 2018) within next 12 (Twelve) weeks. In order to comply with the Honorable HC's order, previous 13 AGMs have already been held and now, I, on behalf of all Board of Directors, would like to welcome you all to the 14th Annual General Meeting (AGM) of year 2019 of the company.

Company Information

Company Formation

Northern Electricity Supply Company (NESCO) Limited was registered on 3rd August, 2005 (vide memo no C-58433 (439)/05) under Company Act 1994 in RJSC as North-West Zone Power Distribution Company Limited (NWZPDCL). NWZPDCL signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and Provisional Power Sales & Purchase Agreement (PSPA) with BPDB on August 01, 2016. Later on 12 September, 2017 the name of the Company was changed to Northern Electricity Supply Company (NESCO) Limited. NESCO started its operation on 1st October, 2016.

Government of The People's Republic Bangladesh has a vision to supply reliable and sustainable electricity to all by 2021. According to Power Sector Master Plan, 2015 (PSMP 2015), Government's plan is to:-

- · Standardize and Strengthen Distribution System
- Transform existing distribution system into a modern distribution network through introducing GIS, DAS and SCADA.
- · Bring all consumers under SMART Meter coverage

NESCO, in line with the vision of current government, works hard & sole for accomplishing 100 percent electricity to all. Along with fulfilling the continuous power demand, NESCO, with the proper guidance of Power Division, aims at contributing to the achievement of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and to implement the pledge "শেখ হাসিনার উদ্যোগ, যরে ঘরে বিদ্যুৎ".

Nature of Business

Northern Electricity Supply Company (NESCO) Limited, An Enterprise of Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB), has been established with a view to distributing & supplying efficient & cost effective electricity to the city & municipality areas of 02 City Corporations, 16 Districts, 39 Upazilas and 37 Municipalities of Rajshahi and Rangpur divisions.





Jurisdiction

The company's core operation encircles within the North-West region of Bangladesh mainly, city & municipalities of Rajshahi & Rangpur divisions (02 City Corporations, 16 Districts, 39 Upazilas and 37 Municipalities) The districts are: Rajshahi, Chapainawabganj, Natore, Naogaon, Joypurhat, Bogura, Pabna, Sirajganj, Rangpur, Gaibandha, Kurigram, Lalmonirhat, Nilphamari, Dinajpur, Thakurgaon & Panchagarh.

Capital Structure

The authorized share capital of the company is BDT 250 crore divided into 2.5 crore equity shares of BDT 100 each. The issued, subscribed and paid-up capital of the company is 999,900 (Nine Lac Ninety Nine Thousand Nine Hundred) taka divided into 9,999 Nos. shares of which Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) is the owner of 9,991 shares rest of the 8 shares are owned by different Institutions/Organizations as per Office Order of Power Division, MPEMR:-


Energy Sales

Billed amount for energy sales for the FY 2018-2019 from different tariff categories has been BDT 2,314 crore whereas; bill collection for the immediately previous financial year was BDT 2,280 crore. Collection of Bill ratio is 98.5%. Sales increase at 11.5% from the immediate previous year. NESCO purchases Electricity solely from Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) at the rate of Tk4.77/kWh (including wheeling charge).

System Loss

System loss is a key performance indicator of any electricity distribution company and is determined by the quantity of energy purchased and sold. The system loss works out to 10.52% in this FY 2018-2019 as against 11.38% in the previous year and 11.91% in FY 2016-2017. System loss reduction from year 2016 to 2019 stands at 1.39%. I along with the other Board of Directors believe that only because of significant effort from the employees of NESCO has made it happen to reduce system loss at such percentage. So, I would like to thank, on behalf of Board of Director, to the concerned team and urge to keep it at single digit.


Current Load Demand of Electricity

Load Demand in the distribution area is gradually increasing. In this FY 2018-2019 maximum load demand was 770 MW which was 512 MW in FY 2017-18 & 438.95 MW in the FY 2016-17. Load demand is in increasing trend. It is expected that, with the uprising demand for electricity along with the growth in new connections the Load Demand for the next Financial Year is projected to reach at 1000 MW limit.

Maximum Load Demand in MW










Substation

NESCO always feels to be consistent with load growth and capacity enhancement. As such it took various initiatives for capacity building. In FY 2016-17, the company had 58, 33/11 KV Substations, increases to 63 in FY 2018-2019 the capacity of which is 1392 MVA (Min)/1892 MVA (Max.)



Two projects of Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) namely, Rajshahi Division Distribution Line Development Project and Rangpur Division Distribution Line Development Project have an arrangement to establish 32 Nos. 33/11 KV Substations. Moreover, two ongoing projects of NESCO, accordingly, Extension and Renovation of Distribution Line & Sub-Station of Rajshahi Division & Extension and Renovation of Distribution Line & Sub-Station of Rangpur Division have an arrangement to establish 03 Nos. 33/11 KV Substations. Within year 2022-2023 these 35 Nos. Substations are expected to be in function.

NESCO focuses on expansion of its source line and distribution network. As of 30 June, 2019 NESCO has the following line structure:



Distribution Transformer

In order to cater the increasing load demand and to enhance distribution capacity, NESCO has installed 7850 Nos. 11/0.4 KV distribution transformers as of 30 June, 2019 capacity of which is 1461.95 MVA. In the previous year, it was 7526 in number and 1277 MVA in capacity.

New Connection

Total number of consumers of NESCO stands at 1,461,954 at the end of current Financial Year whereas; 1,378,258 was at the end of the 2017-2018 FY and 1,293,256 was at the end of 2016-2017 FY. Growth rate of consumers is around 8%. In line with the directions of Bangladesh Investment Development Authority (BIDA), NESCO contributes to Ease of Doing Business Index by providing Domestic consumer connections within 07 days and commercial/Industrial connections within 28 days.




Human Resource Management

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Northern Electricity Supply Company Limited (NESCO)(the Company), which comprise the Statement of Financial Position as at June 30, 2019, Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income, Statement of Changes in Equity and Statement of Cash Flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information disclosed in notes 1 to 28 & Annexure-A & B.

In our opinion, except for the effect of the matter described in the basis for Qualified opinion section of our report the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the company as at June 30, 2019, and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs), the Companies Act 1994 and other applicable laws and regulations.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

- 1. Assets of the company acquired during the year were based on a draft vendor's agreement, which excludes land related with the assets. As per para 18 of IFRS 3 business combination "they acquirer shall measure the identifiable assets acquired a liability assumed at their acquisition-date fair values, but such valuation report was not produced before us for our verification.
- As per IAS 16, para 55 "Depreciation of an asset begins when it is available for use" but the entity charged depreciation on property, plant & equipment addition for six months.
- 3. The entity did not make any tax calculation (Current tax & Deferred tax) as per IAS 12.
- 4. The entity charged bad debt expenses @ 10% on Accounts receivables which is Tk. 689,996,195.00, but Board Resolution and approval from BPDB has not given.
- 5. Provision for Interest expense has been made @ 5% but basis of the same hasn't been provided to us for our verification.





We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Bangladesh, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the IESBA Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

Other Information

Management is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises all of the information in the Annual report other than the financial statements and our auditors' report thereon. The directors are responsible for the other information.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information; we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements and Internal Controls

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with IFRSs, the Companies Act 1994, the Securities and Exchange Rules 1987 and other applicable laws and regulations and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.





Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

 material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report
 to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are
 inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit
 evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or
 conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.

We describe these matters in our auditor's report unless law or regulation precludes public disclosure about the matter or when, in extremely rare circumstances, we determine that a matter should not be communicated in our report because the adverse consequences of doing so would reasonably be expected to outweigh the public interest benefits of such communication.

1. Legal Status & Nature of the Company. Signature Accounting Policies and other Relevant Information

1.1 Legal Status

Northern Electricity Supply Company Limited (NESCO) was incorporated as a public Limited Company by shares, on 03 August, 2005 with on Authorized Capital of TK. 2,500,000,000. Divided into 25,000,000 ordinary shares of Tk.100 each as and paid up Capital to 999,900.00 divided into 9999 ordinary shares of Tk.100 each per share. It is a subsidiary company of Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB).

1.1.1 Principal Activities

The main objective of the Company is to distribute quality electricity to its consumers effectively and efficiently. NESCO started its commercial operations from 01 October 2016 in Rajshahi & Rangpur Division area as per Govt. decision vide order no বিদ্যুৎ, জ্বালানি ও খনিজ সম্পদ মন্ত্রনালয় এর স্মারক নং- 27.00.0000.088.99.006.16.336, তারিখঃ 20.09.2016.

1.2 Basis of Accounting

The Financial Statements have been prepared on historical cost convention in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs), except where otherwise mentioned, and are in compliance with the relevant requirements of the Companies Act, 1994, the Securities and Exchange Rules 1987 and other applicable laws and regulations.

1.3 Property, Plant & Equipment

Valuation of Property, Plants & Equipment purchased by NESCO

All properties handed over by Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) vide order no বিদ্যুৎ, জালানি ও খনিজ সম্পদ মন্ত্রনালয় এর স্মারক নং- 27.00.0000.088.99.006.16.336, তারিখঃ 20.09.2016. After 01.10.2016 Some Plant & equipment purchased by NESCO are recorded at cost considering its purchase price and any directly attributable cost of bringing the assets to working condition for intended use inclusive of inward freight, duties and non-returnable taxes. Vender agreement not yet signs by Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) and NESCO. It will be due in December 2019 informed by NESCO.





1.4. Deprecation

1.4.1 Deprecation is charged at straight line method at rates varying from 3% to 20% depending on category and economic life of the Assets as under:

1.4.2 Full year's depreciation is charged on assets which handed over by BPDB and acquired assets during the year depreciation is charged average six months basis.

1.5 Stores & Spares

Stores & Spares have been started at the lower of cost and net realizable in accordance with IAS 2 "inventories" after making due allowance for any obsolete or slow moving items. The cost of inventories is assigned by using weighted average cost method.

2. Significant Accounting Policies and Basis for preparation of Financial Statements

2.1 Statement of Compliance

The Financial Statements of NESCO have been prepared in accordance with the International Accounting Standards (IASs) and International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs), Companies Act 1994, and other applicable Laws and Regulations.

2.2 Measurement bases used in preparing the Financial Statements

The financial statements have been prepared based on the accrual basis of accounting following going concern assumption and prepared under the historical cost convention.

2.3 Functional and Presentational Currency

The financial statements are prepared in Bangladesh Taka (Tk.), which is the company's functional currency. All financial information presented in Taka has been rounded off to the nearest integer.





2.4 Components of Financial Statements

According to International Accounting Standard (IAS)-1, "presentation of financial statements" the complete set of financial statements includes the following components:

- · Statement of Financial Position
- · Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income
- · Statement of Changes in Equity and
- · Statement of Cash Flows
- Notes to the Financial Statements.

2.5 Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash comprises of cash at banks. IAS-1 "presentation of financial statement provides that cash and cash equivalents are not restricted in use. Cash in hand and bank balances have been considered as cash and cash equivalents.

2.6 Revenue Recognition

- (a) The Company recognizes revenue of energy on issue of bills to the consumers for consumption of energy, demand charge, service charge, meter and transformer rent.
- (b) Other operating income arising from connection / disconnection fees, bills against materials, meter-testing, LPC (Late Payment Surcharge) etc. are recognized on cash basis.
- (c) Interest on short –term deposits (STD) and FDR's with banks is recognized as income on accrual basis.

2.7 Statement of Cash Flows

Statement of Cash Flows is prepared principally in accordance with IAS 7 "Statement of Cash Flows" and the cash flow from operating activities has been presented under the indirect method as required by the Securities and Exchange Rules 1987 and considering the provisions that Enterprises are encouraged to Report Cash Flows from Operating Activities using the "Indirect Method".

2.8 Accounts Receivable

Accounts Receivable for energy stated at realizable amount.

2.9 Related Party Transaction

(a) The "related party" as per IAS -24 is Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB), which holds





2.10 Earning per shares

- (a) Basic Earning per shares (BEPS) Basic Earnings per share has been calculated by dividing the earning attributable to the number of shares (ordinary) outstanding during the year. However neither the "GOB Equity " nor the "Share Deposit" amounts have been considered for determining BEPS and no shares have been allotted against these receipts.
- (b) Diluted Earnings Per Share No diluted Earnings per share was required to be calculated for the year under review as there is no scope for dilution of Earnings per share for the year.

2.11 Retirement Benefit Plants

(a) Contributory Provident Fund

The company maintains a Contributory Provident Fund (CPF), recognized by the National Board of Revenue (NBR), under which the employees contributes 10% of their basic salary to the fund. The company contributes 8.33% on employees contributes. The fund is managed and operated by a Board of Trustees. The net earnings of the fund are apportioned to the Fund member's accounts at the end of the year.

(b) Gratuity

The company maintains a Gratuity Fund, approved by the NBR under income tax Ordinance, 1984, Under the Gratuity Scheme, the company pays to a retired employee having completed at least 3(three) years of service, at the rate of two and half month's last drawn basic salary for every completed year of service. The company pays to the fund for the liability of the end of each year considering the number of years of service of employees eligible under the scheme.

(c) Group Insurance Company's Group Insurance policy under process

2.13 VAT: Company's BIN registration received October 01, 2019.

2.14 Reporting Period

The accounting year of the company covers the year ended from 1 July 2018 to 30 June 2019
